Maatrutva Program

The Program educates pregnant women from underserved communities about health care during pregnancy thereby encouraging them to inculcate health seeking behaviour in them for safe deliveries



231 Pregnant women from under-served communities were registered this month to provide informative sessions



906 Sessions were conducted with registered women informing them about pre-natal care



26% Women registered were in their first Trimester



2717 Follow-Up calls were made to achieve **7859** outcomes



46% Pregnant women registered were primigravida (Pregnant for the first time)



27% Primigravida women were in their first trimester



14% Women registered themselves in the hospital due to our intervention



74% Sessions were completed within 15 days from the time of registration of women



158 '4 ANC' visits were made possible through follow-up



138 Institutional deliveries were registered



99% Women have given colostrum to their new born baby



81% of the new born babies have been at or over 2.5 kgs which is considered to be healthy in infants



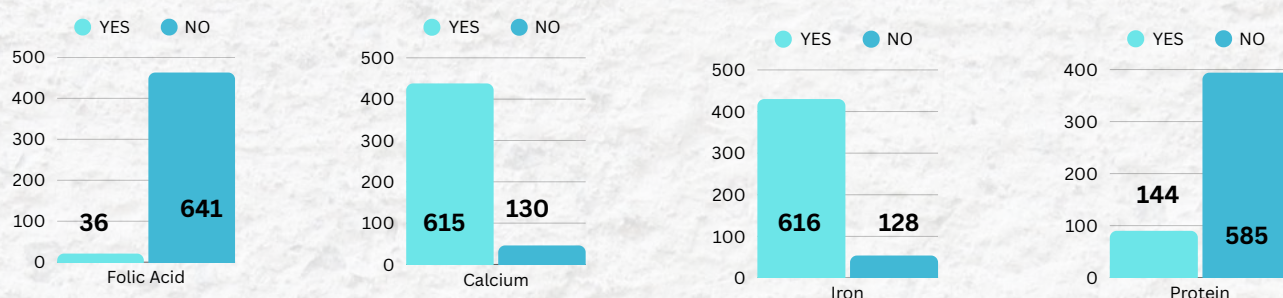
99% Women have been feeding their new born in every 2 hours



2% Women in the community have started using contraceptives post delivery

Follow up with registered pregnant women about the status of supplements received during the course of their pregnancy. The below data is out of 674 calls made this month



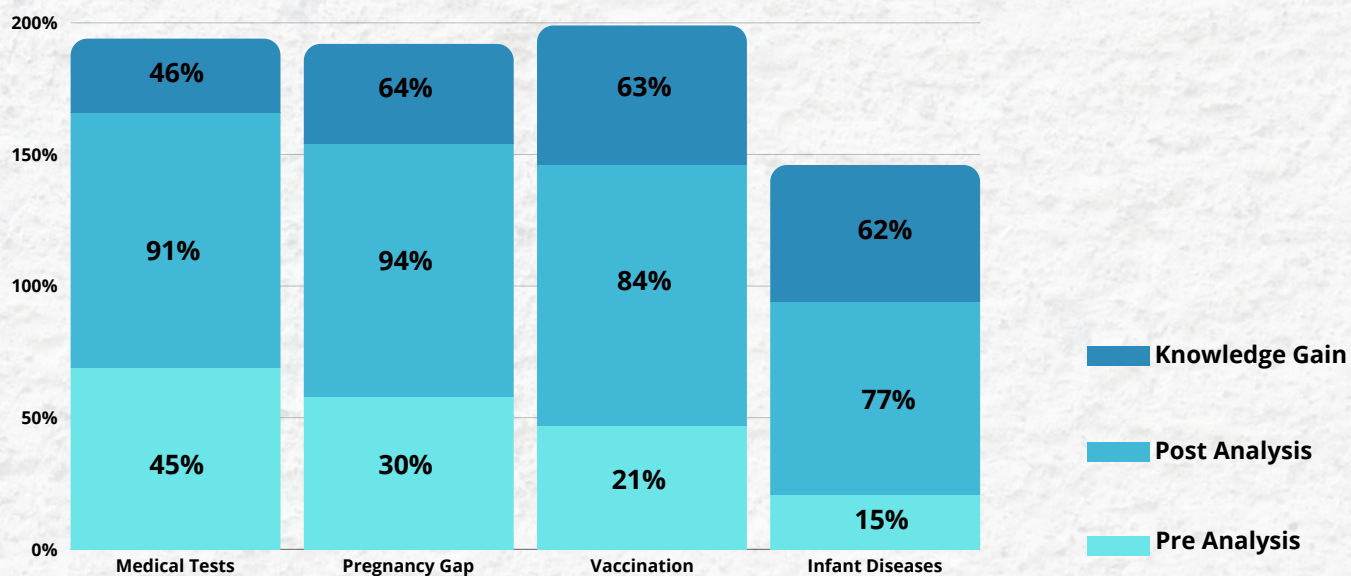
Hemoglobin Level Analysis of women

Follow up with registered women to understand the iron deficiency status amongst **652** women

Control Group (Hb>10.1 gm/100 ml)	Mild Anemia (HB=8.1-10 gm/100 ml)	Moderate Anemia (HB=6.5-8 gm/100 ml)	Severe Anemia (Hb<6.5 gm/100 ml)
22%	23%	1%	0%

Note : 54% women were not tested for Hemoglobin in the hospital

14 Patients and caregivers were provided with an extended accommodation facility at Dr. Ernest Borges Memorial Home, Bandra

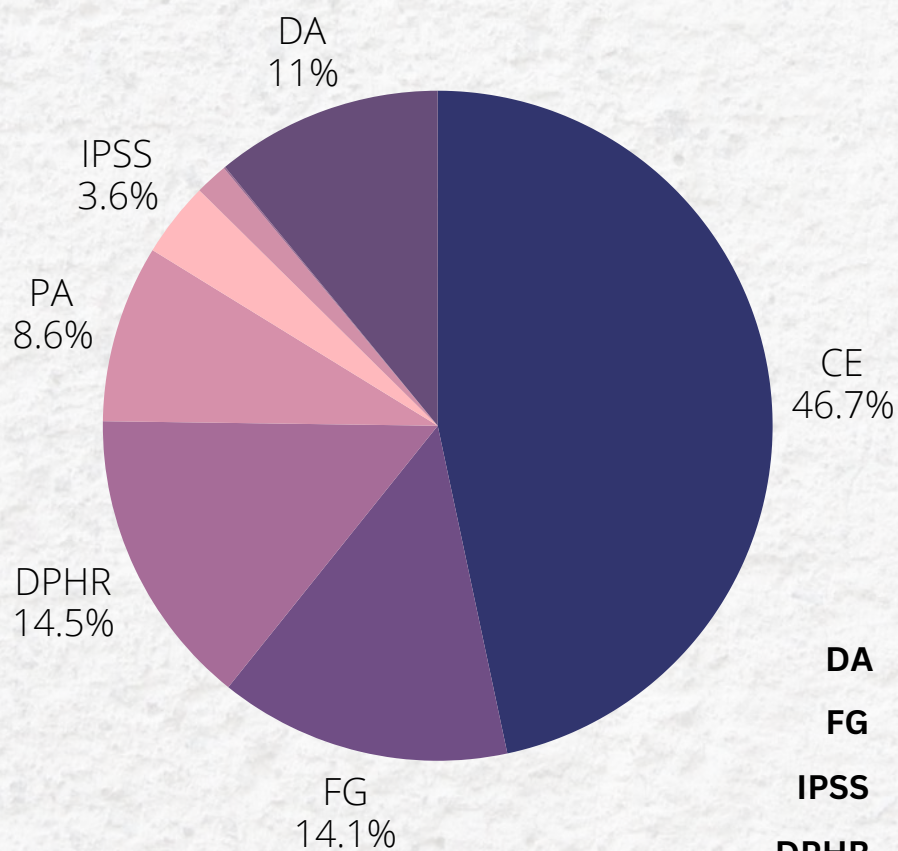
